An ambitious learning environment

Our exceptional teaching and SEND provision continues seamlessly post-16.

The More House traditional **2-year Sixth Form** route offers a broad, ambitious range of over 20 A-Level and Level 3 BTEC subjects. Other enrichment opportunities, such as the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), are also offered.

In the **Foundation year**, pupils are supported to re-visit the GCSE Maths and/or English curriculum and work on the skills and knowledge needed to secure a pass in re-sit examinations. The More House Foundation year is wrapped in unique specialist support, with classes led by subject expert teachers, delivering content in a way that is specifically adapted for neurodiverse learners.

Pupils have a real choice of courses so that they can follow their strengths and interests, and take meaningful steps towards their future goals and ambitions.

Every pupil at More House has access to specialist learning support through the on-site LDC (Learning Development Centre). Support is tailored specifically for the academic demands and personal development required for post-16 study. Study Skills tutors support pupils to develop the skills necessary to manage the new challenges of Sixth Form learning, such as prioritising and workload management for independent learning.



I particularly enjoyed my time in the Sixth Form when I could focus on the 3 A-Level subjects that interested me the most and I felt supported by the staff in my choices and was inspired by their teaching. As a result, I am now studying a degree in Politics and International Relations at university. I still use the organisation, revision and exam strategies shown to me by the MHS learning support team as essential study tools to help me at university.

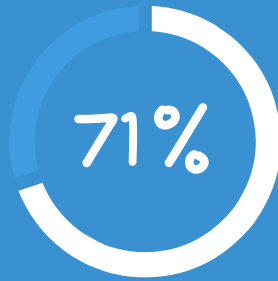

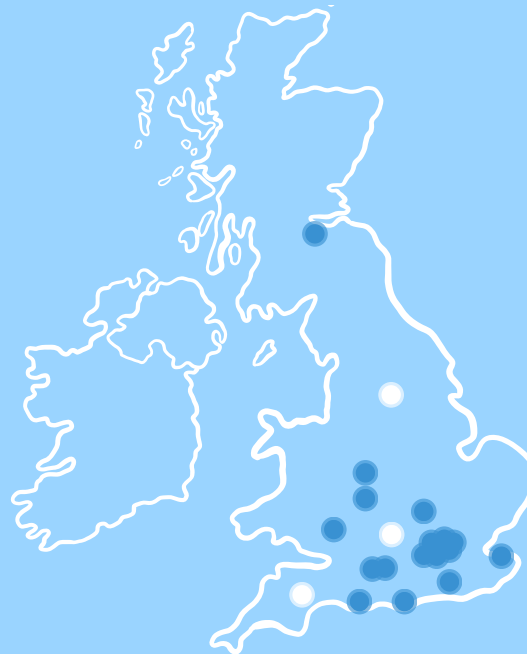

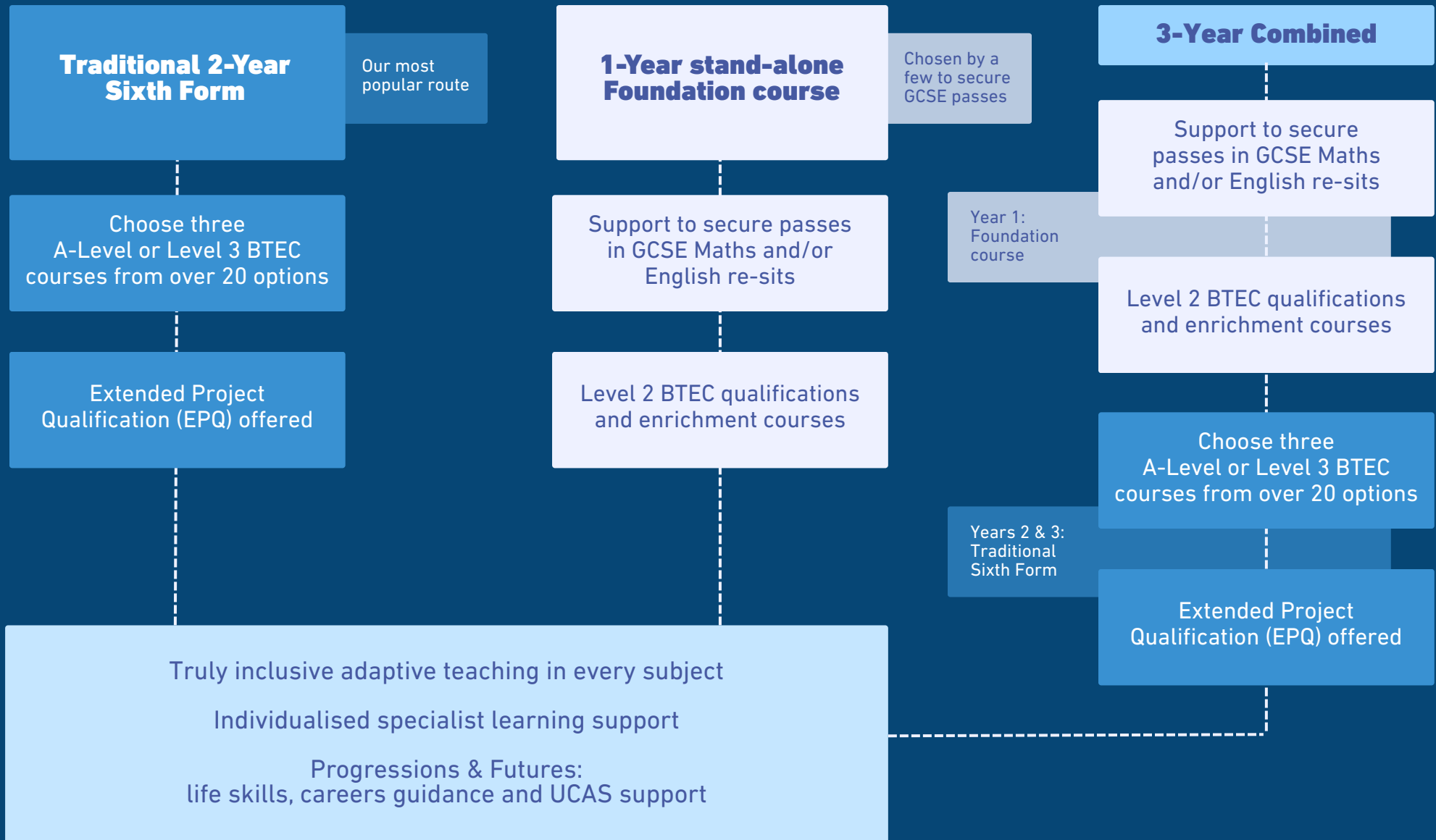

At More House, Sixth Form is about more than academic achievement — it's about equipping young people with the confidence, skills, and independence they need to thrive beyond school.

Our residential provision plays a vital role in this journey. Whether it's mastering essential life skills like laundry and cooking, learning to balance increasing academic demands, or navigating social situations with greater self-awareness, our Sixth Form boarders are supported to take meaningful steps towards adulthood at a pace that works for them.

Often day pupils decide to board with us during the Sixth Form, not out of necessity, but because they recognise the advantages. Boarding removes long daily commutes, giving them extra hours each week to focus on their future, balance their studies, and enjoy a richer school-life experience.

Boarders in the Sixth Form enjoy study bedrooms designed to mirror the layout and feel of university halls — providing the perfect bridge between the familiarity of home and the independence of adult life.

Beyond the boarding houses, pupils benefit from access to a wide range of on-site facilities, including a fully equipped gym, creative studios, dedicated study spaces, and calm social areas.



Structured mentoring and close links between school and boarding staff promote students' self-confidence, independence and self-advocacy. Students receive guidance on managing complex homework, attending university interviews and navigating challenging tasks successfully.
